9. Times Have Changed

Many years ago, small children were made to work in factories and in other industries. They would start at four o'clock in the morning and work through until after ten o'clock at night. This meant that they never saw the sun or had time to play.

On waking up in the morning, they would be given a small bowl of watery porridge. At night, before going to bed, they were lucky if they received some soup for supper. During the day only a short break was allowed, with possibly some bread to eat.

Many of these children became very sick and died. The owners of the factories made the children work very hard, often beating them if they fell asleep. Times were hard, and people were just expected to survive or die.

Some of the types of work, that the children did, were working down the mines, weaving cotton on the heavy looms or climbing up chimneys to clean away the soot. At the end of the day there would be no hot bath or shower. Clean up would be a bowl of freezing cold water and carbolic soap. Then off to bed to sleep in rough, heshian bags.

Today young children are not allowed to work, and are certainly looked after much better!
