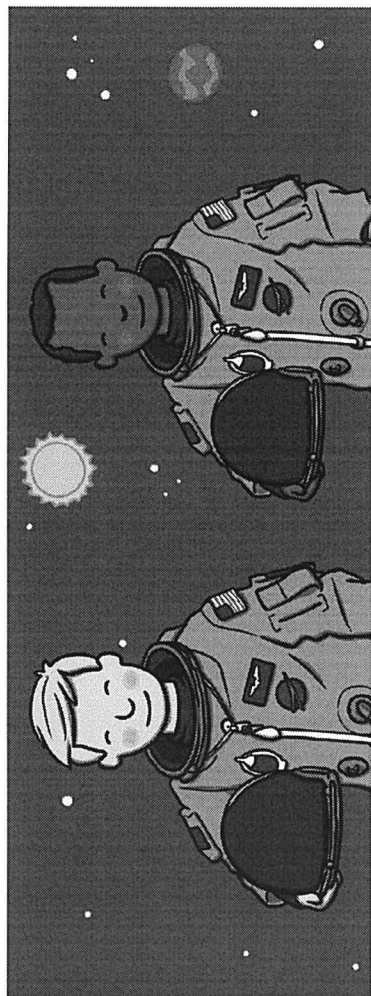


A Space Adventure!

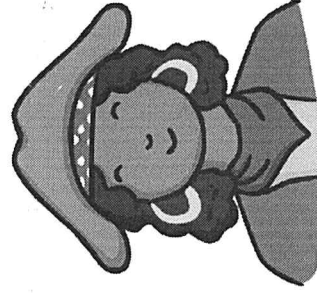
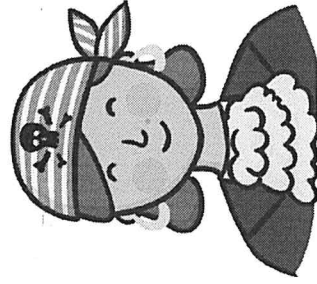

109 and did not win the battle.

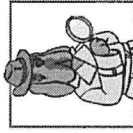

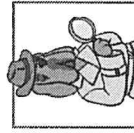
