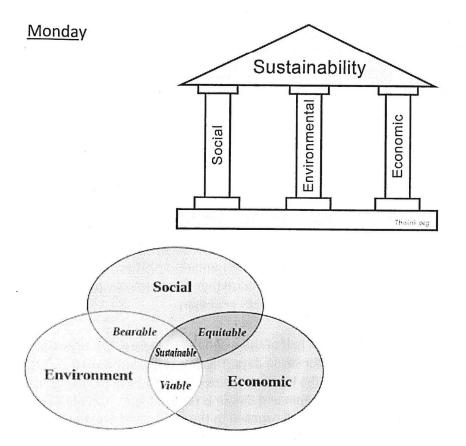

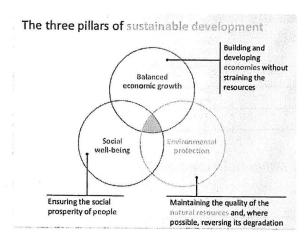

Now I even have some time to rest!

My family's favourite dish is rice, bananas, beans and vegetables. When I heard about the new stoves, I thought this was great news. Trees are not as numerous as they used to be. At the moment, we don't have many trees at all. When I heard that these stoves would help us use less wood and cut down less trees than before I was very happy.

The new stove means that I now use less than half of the wood I used before. The firewood that I used for just three days now lasts me for seven days. Before you start your persuasive text, you should complete the work about persuasive devices to help you.

Emotive Language	Questions asked just for effect, or to emphasise a point.
Alliteration	Words used to make the reader feel like you are talking to them.
Personal Pronouns	Repetition of the same sound at the beginning of words.
Exaggeration	Language used to make the reader feel certain emotions.
Rule of 3	Words used to indicate the degree to which something is probable.
Rhetorical Questions	Providing information that is inflated, or over-the-top.
Repetition	Important words or phrases that are used more than once.
Modality	Three adjectives or phrases used together to emphasise a point.

Read the persuasive devices listed above. Think about the number of times you have used them in the classroom. Match them with the definition. Remember to use a number of devices in your text.

Identifying Persuasive Devices

Read each sentence. Work out the persuasive devices being used to try to persuade the reader. Explain your answers.
